

Absentee Voting



Absentee Voting Overview

- Absentee voting is available for town election.
- It **not** available for town meeting or the annual school meetings.

You can vote absentee for any of these reasons:

- Being absent from town
- Religious observance
- Disability or illness
- Employment commitments (including caregiving)

Absentee ballots may also be available when a weather emergency impacts an election.

Requesting an Absentee Ballot

1. Print your [absentee ballot request form](#) or you can pick one up at the Town Clerk's office.
2. Sign the form and return to Hollis Town Clerk **with copy of photo ID**:
 - Return to Town Clerk in person;
 - Use drop box at Town Clerk's office; **OR**
 - Send through USPS (Town Clerk, 3G Market Pl, Hollis, NH 03049)
3. Check your absentee ballot request status on the SoS website:



Completing & Returning Your Absentee Ballot

1. Fill out the ballot, following the instructions.
2. Put the ballot inside the smaller affidavit envelope that came with the ballot, then seal **and sign** that envelope.
3. Put the affidavit envelope inside the larger return envelope.
4. In the upper left corner of the outer envelope, print the voter's name, address, and voting place. If returning via mail, add necessary postage.
5. Sign the form and return to Hollis Town Clerk.
 - Return to Town Clerk in person – **do not use the outside drop box**
 - Send through USPS (Town Clerk, 3G Market Place, Hollis, NH 03049).
6. Ballot must be received **no later than 5pm** at the polling place (HBHS) on Election Day (Tuesday, March 10th).

Amendment 1

1. AMENDMENT (1) ARE YOU IN FAVOR OF ADOPTION OF AMENDMENT (1) AS PROPOSED BY THE PLANNING BOARD FOR THE TOWN OF HOLLIS ZONING ORDINANCE AS FOLLOWS?

(a) Amend Chapter IX: General Provisions, Section J, Number of Residential Units Which may be Constructed on a Lot by amending the paragraph as follows:

One single family dwelling unit, or one 2 family dwelling unit, and an Accessory Dwelling Unit as the case may be, may be constructed on a single lot, except under the provisions of the ~~accessory dwelling units, elderly/disabled housing, and condominium~~ other sections of this Ordinance, where the number of dwelling units which may be permitted on a lot is determined by ~~a Special Exception granted by the Board of Adjustment and/or approval by the Zoning Ordinance and~~ the Planning Board under its Conditional Use Permit Authority, and/or Subdivision and Site Plan Review Regulations, as required.

(b) And amend Chapter IX: General Provisions, Section O. Determination of Density for Condominium Developments by amending the paragraph as follows:

The number of permissible single family or two-family dwelling units in a condominium subdivision shall be the same as that which would be applicable for a conventional subdivision of the contemplated housing type. Similarly, any single family or two-family dwelling units proposed to be built as part of a condominium development shall be required to demonstrate compliance with the Building Area requirements set forth herein. It is required that each single family or two-family dwelling unit must have an exclusive non-overlapping building area in order to demonstrate compliance.

Amend Chapter IX, General Provisions, K. Accessory Dwelling Units, 3. Requirements / Limitations, a. by amending the paragraph to remove reference to ZBA and character provision.

Accessory dwelling units are intended to be secondary and accessory to a principal single-family dwelling unit. ~~In granting a special exception, the Board of Adjustment must find that the secondary dwelling unit is developed in a manner which does not alter the character or appearance of the principal dwelling unit as a single family residence.~~ Only one accessory dwelling unit shall be allowed per principal dwelling unit and/or lot. The accessory dwelling unit shall have a separate house number from the principal dwelling.

Amend Chapter IX: General Provisions, Section N. Unregistered Vehicles, as follows:

No more than one disabled or unregistered motor vehicle shall be visible from public view on any property, other than a permitted business in that zone. ~~Registered vehicles shall have current inspections.~~

4. **AMENDMENT (4)** ARE YOU IN FAVOR OF ADOPTION OF AMENDMENT (4) AS PROPOSED BY THE PLANNING BOARD FOR THE TOWN OF HOLLIS ZONING ORDINANCE AS FOLLOWS:

Amend Chapter XVIII: Hollis Open Space Planned Development, Section E, Density, Dimensional, Open Space and Health Requirements in a HOSPD:

To meet the Purpose statements of this Ordinance, the arrangement of lots shall be designed to provide a diversity of contexts. The placement of lots in long, uninterrupted rows shall be avoided, and breaks incorporating open space with existing undisturbed vegetation or appropriate replantings shall be introduced to create a more rural atmosphere, as outlined in the Hollis Rural Character Preservation Ordinance. In addition, the setbacks of homes shall be staggered to reduce the monotony of housing units lining a roadway. These and other design features are encouraged to be reviewed with the Planning Board during the Design Review phase of the approval process.

To achieve an HOSPD plan that adheres to the Purpose of this Ordinance to the maximum extent possible, the Planning Board may waive the standards for lot size, frontage, open space location, and building setbacks contained in this Section, but under no circumstances shall the number of lots be increased.

Amend Zoning Ordinance Chapter XIV: Adult Sexually Oriented Businesses Ordinance, Section C. General Requirements, as follows:

2. No adult sexually oriented business shall be permitted within seven hundred fifty (750) feet of any **residence**, public sports/recreation park, church, place of worship, parish house, convent, public, parochial, or private school, drug free zone, kindergarten, licensed day care or nursery school, or State approved day care center.


Open Enrollment

Article 7 of Hollis School District Warrant

Article 6 of COOP School District Warrant

Vote **YES** on **Both Open Enrollment Warrant Articles**

- Multiple open enrollment bills filed at the start of 2025 legislative session in January
- Warrant articles are being offered as a result of Fall 2025 court ruling indicating that lack of a defined number of open enrollment students would imply unrestricted open enrollment in Hollis-Brookline
- Hollis warrant article limits to 1 student in; and zero out
- COOP warrant article (amended at the COOP budget meeting) limits to 4 total, 1 per grade, and only in the high school; zero students out
- Both school boards voted in favor of these warrant articles
- In late January, the Senate quickly passed the version of open enrollment that has resulted in school admins across the state to reject it through a signed letter
- Hollis School Board members and Hollis Budget Committee have signed on to this letter
- Major issues: too many open questions in how this is implemented; how is special ed. coordinated?; school capacity isn't defined; lack of legislative process
- If the House passes HB 751 and Governor signs it into law, the warrant articles will have no effect
